

BOXSTER UPDATE

It all started innocently enough - last year at this time I sent Doug a little April Fools story entitled "Boxster to be built in New Hampshire". This bit of fiction was sprinkled with fanciful, quasi-believable "facts" and claimed that the new Porsche 986, the Boxster was to be assembled at a yet secret site in the Granite State. I thought that the tale which included myself having "beer and brats" with Ferry Porsche was outlandish enough to raise a few smiles, but not to be believed. Just in case, it was dated 1 April, and contained the fictional PCNA employee Olaf Prial an anagram for "April Fool". Well, just as I have misjudged the gullibility of rallyists, I misjudged the willingness to believe what people want to believe.

The first reaction to the story is what I expected. PCA friends told me how they first believed the story, usually getting the joke on the second read. A few made excited phone calls before getting the joke. A few believed the Boxster was going to be built at Pease Air Force Base, confirming rumors in the press regarding a German car manufacturer coming to the state. This however was just the start.

By the time of the Parade in Lake Placid, Doug informed me that several other newsletters had reprinted the Boxster article. Unfortunately many of these did not include the April first date. I doubt most people expected an April Fools story in the Summer months. The story and its author had gained some notoriety.

In the Fall Doug talked with Larry Wilson, the PCA Newsletter Chairman about the widespread publication of the article. Larry related that he had even had inquiries from PCNA in Reno. The Boxster story had made its way to the factory in Stuttgart and they had called Reno to get more details. They said that they didn't "always know what Prof. Porsche was up to." The story now had a life of its own.

The next caller was the founder of the newly formed 986 Club. He wanted to arrange for a tour of the new factory. Although disappointed, he was finally convinced that the story was a joke and settled for reprinting it in their new newsletter.

The latest, but not final chapter was the phone call Past-President Steve Gratton received from Governor Merrill's office in February. It seems that his assistant in charge of encouraging business and industrial development in the state had gotten a phone call congratulating him on landing the Porsche factory in New Hampshire from his counterpart in Florida. He was skeptical when Steve tried to convince him that this was all a joke.

I had planned on a follow-up story with more outrageous "facts" and even photos of the new plant and a first driving impression. But, I think I've caused enough trouble. I can only hope that Porsche decides after all this to just go ahead and build a plant here to build the Boxster since that's what everyone believes already. fred

BLUE RIDGE PARKWAY - A WINTER ODYSSEY

Having made many trips to Florida to visit my parents. I have often eyed that long green squiggle on the map known as the Blue Ridge Parkway. From the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, it snakes through the Appalachian crests and ridges 469 miles, where it meets the Skyline Drive in Shenandoah National Park.



This year, with the 1989 928-S4 outfitted with four matching Dunlop Winter Sport snow tires, an extra travel day and a forecast of good weather, we decided to do it. After visiting Amanda's mother in Atlanta, we picked up the parkway in Asheville, North Carolina at about 9:00 am. There was no traffic - such a relief after the crowded interstates and squirrelly holiday drivers. After less than 20 miles of delightful driving and mind-blowing scenery, we encountered a barrier.

Hoping there would only be a short detour, we got onto the side road and meandered in a generally northerly direction through a picturesque village, the name of which was not on our map. The big sign warning of unpaved steep mountain roads ahead for many miles suggested that this was not where we wanted to be.

Some friendly farm folks gave us the local's perspective because ice accumulates in the shady bends, and winter maintenance does not exist, large portions of the road are closed for most of the winter. They advised us to go back the way we came to the ranger station for more information and current conditions.



Back at the Folk Art Center and Visitor's Center, a large, clean modern facility with gift shop, ranger's desk, art gallery and ample parking belying the summer popularity of this highway, a friendly national park ranger showed us a map of the parkway with current road closures marked on it. Some fifty miles of roadway were closed around the Mount Mitchell area (Mt. Mitchell, at 6,684 feet is the highest peak east of the Mississippi River). This was hit hard by the hurricanes and may take years to re-open. Photos of the damage were prominently displayed. One featured a large washout that had taken out both lanes for about thirty feet. There was a surprisingly large patch

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of pavement - more than enough to mistakenly venture onto - left dangling in the air over the precipice: all the ground had been washed out from under it. But all was not lost for us: north of Linville Falls the road was open all the way. The ranger gave us an official map on which she highlighted the best route, and we were on our way.

In the afternoon we traveled only about 120 miles. We stopped frequently to admire the views from some of the many well-maintained pullouts. With the leaves off the hardwoods, the shapes of the trees stood out gloriously against the silvery winter sky and the views opened up.

The parkway speed limit is 45, which is pretty fast for the road. While the 928 can easily do more, a lesser vehicle would have a hard time maintaining that through the copious curves, and the scenery kept distracting this driver. And despite being quite comfortable with the sunroof open, there was enough water on the road that I was very glad to have a thermometer on the dashboard telling me it was 56 degrees, above freezing! Further down the road there were indeed large chunks of ice on the roadside. We got gas and lunch in Sparta, and turned off at the town of Fancy Gap just before twilight.



The next day we went another 80 miles to Roanoke where we rejoined the madding crowd on the interstate. Can hardly wait to explore the rest of it! Begun in 1935 as a CCC project and finally completed in 1987, this two-lane road passes by countless picturesque farms, pioneer homesteads, panoramic vistas, and historical sites, alternating with virtual tunnels of lush rhododendron. Our experience on this high road in winter was fabulous, owing to good weather and a scarcity of other cars on the road. The cars we did see tended to be courteous and mellow. 1 can imagine that the summer traffic could be much less pleasant. In winter, most of the parkway facilities are closed, which led us to take a rest stop in the woods (remember to put that T.P. in the litter bag: covering it with leaves doesn't work!) There by a tree, a log cabin in the distance, no traffic whizzing by, and only the sound of the breeze in the trees, one feels a special isolation. By a small stretch of imagination one is transported back to a simpler time of automotive travel, before bumper-tobumper bozos and endless strip malls. And finally you understand what Goethe meant by "over all the mountain tops is peace."

The frequent signs warning "beware of sudden icing." and "avoid parkway in fog, rain and snow." remind us that this is real mountain driving, and the road and the weather demand respect. We got through with a little dumb luck, but you might want to plan ahead.

1930 CORD L29 BROOKS STEVENS SPEEDSTER AND 1932 ALFA ROMEO 8C 2300 ZAGATO SPYDER WIN BEST OF SHOW AT AMELIA ISLAND CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE by AMELIA ISLAND CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE

More than 32,000 People and 315 Automobiles and Motorcycles Attend The 20th Anniversary of the World's Most Innovative Concours Weekend.

JACKSONVILLE, FLA. (March 18, 2015) – The Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance named a 1930 Cord and 1932 Alfa Romeo Best in Show winners on Sunday, March 15, during the 20th annual event which attracted a record-breaking crowd of 32,000 over the course of the weekend. "The Amelia," known for its innovative car classes, showcased more than 315 cars and motorcycles on Concours Sunday, with the stunning 1930 Cord L29 winning the prestigious Concours d'Elegance award and the Alfa Romeo 8C 2300 taking home the coveted Concours de Sport accolade.

The Concours d'Elegance award was given to the flawless 1930 Cord L29 Brooks Stevens Speedster, which is owned by Ed and Judy Schoenthaler from Oak Brook, IL. This black and white modern-classic was completely redesigned by renowned Wisconsin architect and car designer Stevens who acquired it in 1930. The Cord competed in many driving events including the Copperstate 1000 Rally and several hill climbs and races until Steven's death in 1995.

The 1932 Alfa Romeo 8C 2300, owned by David Sydorick of Beverly Hills, CA, was awarded the coveted Concours de Sport prize thanks to its outstanding racing heritage and impeccable restoration. The short chassis "two-three" Spyder 8C was introduced in 1931 and won the Mille Miglia in 1932, 1933 and 1934 as well as the Spa 24-hour race in 1932. The car has a powerful Jano-designed straight-eight twin overhead cam supercharged engine. The previous owner purchased it in 1950 with a broken clutch. In 2003 Sydorick bought the vehicle and had Wisconsin-based restorer Rick Bunkfield rebuild the engine in 2005 to make it drivable once again.

"Both the Cord L29 and the Alfa Romeo 8C 2300 are well deserving of the Amelia's 20th Anniversary Best in Show awards, with their impressive automotive style and historical pedigree," said Bill Warner, Chairman and Founder of the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance. "I'm not sure how our esteemed panel of judges was able to pick just two winners, given the record number of world-class entrants we had at this year's Concours. I congratulate them on their excellent selections and I hope

we can make their job harder in 2016."

More than 315 magnificent cars and motorcycles from around the world participated in the 2015 Concours, delighting attendees with a remarkable automotive display of style and heritage. This year Stutz was the featured margue. Highlights on the field included the presence of automotive history's most rare classic models: the BMW 328, a collection of 1940s wood-bodied Chrysler models, the Porsche 914 model in its rarest variations and a plethora of pre and post-war racecars. Also on display were a number of outside of the box car classes such as a rare Orphan Concept class including the 1954 DeSoto Adventurer, "Cars of the Cowboys" highlighting legendary western themed vehicles from TV and film and a "World Rally Car" class. In addition, a "Hot Rods: East Meets West" car class delighted car fans by highlighting the differences between East Coast and West Coast customizers and classic Hot Rod styling.

Leading the 2015 Concours was Honoree and legendary race car driver Sir Stirling Moss, who was also the event's first Honoree at the inaugural Amelia Concours in 1996. Moss was honored for his achievements in motor racing and the tremendous legacy he continues to build upon. In addition, attendees were treated to the presence of over 25 of Sir Stirling Moss' famous race cars, including the three Mercedes-Benz silver arrows he won with in 1955, marking the first time all three historic vehicles were displayed together.

In addition, some of the world's most prominent manufacturers and dealers chose the Amelia Concours to debut their latest models and creations. Lamborghini held the North American debut of the company's newest and fastest super car, the Aventador LP 750-4 Superveloce, following the vehicle's global debut at the Geneva Motor Show earlier this month. Galpin Motors and Henrik Fisker also held the global unveiling of Fisker's stunning GT Coupe design study, "Thunderbolt," based on his personal interpretation of the Aston Martin V12 Vanquish Coupe. Galpin also displayed the production-ready version of the Mustang "Rocket," which debuted at the 2014 Los Angeles Auto Show.

Manufacturers Alfa Romeo, BMW, Buick, Infiniti, Jaguar, Porsche, Lamborghini, Maserati, Mercedes-Benz and Panoz

also participated in the 2015 event.

Attendees also enjoyed two seminars, a tradition that has become one of the hallmarks of the Amelia Island Concours. The "Design DNA of Iconic Cars" seminar included designers from General Motors, Mercedes-Benz and Porsche who spoke about maintaining each brands' DNA. The legendary Buick Y-Job, America's first true concept car and the Buick Avenir Concept were on display to enhance the seminar. In the seminar moderated by Tommy Kendall, Wayne Carini, Ray Evernham, Peter Klutt, Barry Meguiar, Bob Scanlon and Dale Walksler lead a lively discussion about the "The Car Guys of Television," which gave a behind-the-scenes look at producing automotive television shows.

This year's RM Sotheby's Amelia Island, FL auction broke records by achieving the highest auction results in Amelia Island Concours history, garnering \$60,328,550 in sales. A 1960 Ferrari 400 Superamerica SWB Cabriolet was the most valuable vehicle sold during the 2015 Amelia Island Concours week, selling for \$6,380,000. Proceeds for this car's sale will benefit the consignor's charity for the education of children.

The 21st annual Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance will be held March 11-13th, 2016 at The Golf Club of Amelia Island at The Ritz-Carlton, Amelia Island. The show's Foundation has donated over \$2.5 million to Community Hospice of Northeast Florida, Inc., Spina Bifida of Jacksonville and other charities on Florida's First Coast since its inception in 1996. In 2013, the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance won Octane Magazine's EFG International Historic Motoring Event of the Year award.

About the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance Now in its second decade, the Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance is among the top automotive events in the world. Always held the second full weekend in March, "Amelia" draws over 300 rare vehicles from collections around the world to The Golf Club of Amelia Island, The Ritz-Carlton, Amelia Island for a celebration of the automobile like no other. 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AMAZING TASMANIA by David Churcher

Porsche enthusiasts and their mechanics are all over the world but the enthusiasts and mechanics in Tasmania must be the furthest from Stuttgart in all the world. This remoteness, you would think, would be cause for alarm. Can one get a Porsche fixed in Tasmania? And, indeed, can one get enough sports car stimulation in Tasmania? The answer to both questions is "yes!" and my February/ March trip provided some fine examples.

Tasmania has always enjoyed a special relationship with motor sports. In the 1960s the Longford Circuit was active and attracted drivers such as Brabham, Clark, Hill, McLaren and Surtees. These days in late March The Longford Revival attracts classic cars and also the Porsche Museum. A few weeks later The Targa Tasmania takes place. The Porsche Museum provides cars for the Targa ... see Christophorus for a story on Porsche at The Targa in 2013.

But my story for here begins with conversations with friend Inge. David and Inge Hillier bought a 996 which had been modified by an engine swap. That was two years ago and the car is still not on the road. I was curious to know why the car was not running and what the process was for getting it on the road. After all, to own a 996 and be in Tasmania would be a joy. But to have a none-working 996 in Tasmania would be a frustration.

Inge told me over lunch the problems were electrical and computer related. I found this a little strange because engine swaps of this kind are not unusual. There had to be a story here. So Inge and David put me in touch with their mechanic Simon Kernan who lives "up the coast" at Devonport. Simon agreed to spending his Friday afternoon with me talking Porsches, but he actually provided me with more: a spectacular and mind boggling afternoon of stories, cars, and enthusiasts.

Simon describes himself as a "1970 model" who did his apprenticeship as an automotive electrician and today he has a business doing "a bit of everything" in his shed. In Australia a lot of businesses are in "a shed" and "a shed" is usually corrugated steel siding and roof on a slab. They come in all sizes and accommodate all sizes of garages and machine shops. Simon's shed contains several machine tools, welding equipment, and a lift. During my visit I saw current projects, future projects, and a photo collection of past projects. But I did **not** see David and Inge's 996.

The 996 has been removed to storage and awaits a second attempt of getting the correct computer sent out from the UK. It appears the engine now in the 996 has a Super VarioCam and the original electrics and computer will not work or even turn the engine over. Frustration. But recent news from the UK indicates the combination has been assembled over there, the example 996 did run, and the needed computer is on its way to Tasmania

Current projects in Simon's shed include a Holden HT being restored and a new V8 being installed. Some custom sheet metal is being shaped and a custom petrol tank (gas tank) made by Simon is already in but presently wrapped in plastic to protect its brushed surface. The stainless muffler system on the Holden is made by Simon and looks like a sculptured work of art. Future projects include restoring a Lotus space frame presently stored in the loft. The photo collection included hot rods, Targa cars, and a "special" powered by a Rolls Royce Merlin engine ...the Merlin is the engine which powered the Spitfire in WW II.

The afternoon then unfolded into two more experiences which left me (as they say in Aus) "Gobsmacked." On the drive to the first of these experiences we passed by Delta Hydraulics which is a shop owned by the Whites who have won the Targa Tasmania with their Lambo. We headed into town to Robin's shop. Here was the first of the surprises: a Dino Ferrari (which Simon worked on as an apprentice), two E-Types, two Cobras, and a beautiful C4. Robin had a Porsche repair business on The Gold Coast and has relocated to Tasmania where he is now a Porsche mechanic in demand. While I enjoyed the banter and the accents and car stories Robin referred to a friend who had a car collection which we would see in an hour or so. Robin said his friend often said he should take "one of the cars" out on a weekend and have some fun. Robin's reply was: I want to get away from cars on my weekends. This has to be Tasmanian humour at its best. An hour later I saw this collection ... I would not have to be asked twice to take one of these cars out. :-)

We have all heard urban legend stories of great collections stored away. We have heard of great "barn finds" of exotic cars. The collection I was about to see is owned by an engineer who works on some big overseas projects.

He started to buy sports cars soon after he graduated from the University of Tasmania. Today, some 50 years on, the collection is stored in an inconspicuous industrial building and is shown only by special arrangement. I was lucky enough to have such an arrangement made by Simon and Robin.

I had listened to the stories of the owner and his offers to Robin to take a car out for a weekend. I understood I was about to see something special. I was not prepared for what I saw when the door opened and the lights went on.

The area was about 30m by 60m and filled with cars ... some covered, some on trickle charge, some just dusty beauties. On my left a Lotus 7, a JWS (Australian special from the 1960s), a restored Ferrari with a Jaguar V12 engine, a Ferrari, another Ferrari, another Ferrari, a GT3, an E-Type, an Austin Healy 100S. After I regained my composure I was stuck with a problem: how to photograph these beauties and bring my story to NCR. I decided there was not much "art" to be had in my photographs and the best I could do was to just record this amazing scene and try to show it as I saw it when the door opened and the lights went on.

Amazing Tasmania. I have always said if the landscapes do not get your attention the food and wine will. And now I add that if you have good contacts in motor sport the cars will also get your attention



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The Eyes Have It

If you're reading this, you may or may not know the name. But you certainly know the work.

Giorgetto Giugiaro. He was named Car Designer of the Century in 1999, and inducted into the Automotive Hall of Fame in 2002.

The founder of Italdesign, Giugiaro is credited with, among others, the original VW Golf, Passat and Scirocco, the DeLorean DMC-12, the Lotus Esprit, the Iso Rivolta and Grifo, the BMW M1, the Bugatti EB 118, the De Tomaso Mangusta, the Maserati Ghibli, Bora and Merak, and the Fiat 850 Spider.

Along the way, he's also sketched numerous Nikon cameras, Beretta firearms, Ducati motorcycles, and Seiko watches, as well as aircraft interiors, tractors, skis, golf clubs telephones and a dentist chair that's supposed to actually be inviting.

Why should we care? Because, aside from the fact that the man's an acknowledged genius, the Volkswagen Group bought a 90.1% interest in his firm in 2012.

The purchase was made through VW's Lamborghini sports car unit.

I think it's a safe bet that Giugiaro is having an impact across the VW product roster. And, with lead times what they are, we should see his influence, more and more, in the coming years.

Which is why I read with great interest a story on Giugiaro that appeared recently in The Wall Street Journal.

It was a profile and interview with the man, now 77. The headline reads "Car Designer Giorgetto Giugiaro on Comfort, Curves and Drawing Tools." And the subhead reads "The prolific designer discusses the best place to test drive a car and why the horse is the perfect animal."

Yes indeed, there it is, in the second paragraph... he's now working exclusively with the Volkswagen Audi Group. In fact, at the recent Geneva Car Show, he unveiled the Gea concept car, which allows passengers to work, sleep and even exercise.

Some highlights from the interview:

The best place to test drive a car is "Sardinia. It offers gorgeous scenery, few people and little traffic...."

The car he drives today is "a 2014 Audi A7 TDI. It is a very elegant car, precious and prestigeous, a performance car... for rich people."

The designs that most impress him are "certain very common and anonymously designed objects - corkscrews, needles, scissors, forks, knives."

A common design pitfall is "to design something that has no other value than being something 'new.' It has no function, it is not design."

The most beautifully designed cities in the world are "Athens and Rome — real capitals of our Western civility. I think of the Acropolis in Athens, and the Colosseum in Rome."

The one thing you will not find in his home is "a single drawing or anything related to cars. Everybody is quite surprised at this. But I like to simply have art and rare objects around me at home. I work with cars all day long, every single day of my life."

A trend he doesn't subscribe to is "cars with rounded lines. You lose a remarkable amount of space. Square lines and flat surfaces allow designers to use inner room the best, both for passengers, mechanics and luggage."

When buying a car, it's important to consider "its interior, apart from any pleasure you might get from the external shape and architecture of it. Important features of an interior are comfort, functionality, visibility and having enough space to move around."

The animal he most admires is "the horse. It is the most perfectly designed animal in terms of form, motion and function. I also admire the design of the shark and cheetah. They transform the concept of aggressiveness into harmony and speed."

O to participate in the interview with this great man.

Here are a few of the questions I would have posed.

How do you feel about all the add-on scoops, ducts, intakes, exhausts, spoilers and what-not that seem to clutter up a design that you may have spent forever to come up with?

If an interior should be one of harmony and simplicity, how do you reconcile that with automotive touch screens, track pads, paddles and joy sticks?

And I would slip one in, just for grins; how do you feel about Hollywood taking one of your iconic designs and twisting it into the centerpiece of a feature film?

I like to think he'd probably chuckle, sip his espresso and note that the film made his design a worldwide icon. And it grossed millions.

There's no accounting for taste.

Auto Detailing Tech Session

A couple of warm days this past week of early March, have PCA members counting down the days until they can take their cars out of storage and back on the road. What better way to spend a cool rainy March 14th morning than attending the Auto Detailing Tech Session at Prestige & Elite Auto Detailing in North Hampton, NH. About thirty members were treated to a four hour demonstration of professional vehicle detailing, by 30 year veteran, David Gallagher. Dave specializes in Exotic, Luxury and Classic cars.

PCA member Dave Doran drives his 2013 911 Carrera all year long, so it was the perfect demonstration vehicle. Dave Gallagher took us step by step from the wash process to interior cleaning. He shared many tricks of the trade developed from detailing hundreds of exotic cars. Visit Dave's web site at www.prestigeandelite.com for a listing of the services he provides.

While I copied four pages of detailed instruction, I will hit the highlights. The process begins with a hot water power wash using a flexible hose nozzle and Meguiar's Gold Soap. Make sure you get the undercarriage, wheel wells, and exterior of the car. Dave also cleans the engine compartment and he uses an acid cleaner (very carefully!) for the rims. Dave spent about two hours washing the Drying begins with a blade scraper, followed by synthetic chamois, compressed air and fans. Once the car is completely dry, he masked off the seams, rubber, and badges before starting on the paint. He demonstrated how to use a Rupes 15 buffer to remove surface scratches. swirls and imperfections. Only use Porsche touch up paint and DO NOT store it in your glove box. Store it at a moderate temperature in the house. Do not apply paint sealer or wax in sunlight or when the metal is hot. When Dave was finished with the Three Step Paint Detailing, the

Carrera was in like new, showroom condition.

With Cabriolet tops, Dave recommended cleaning with soap and water only. Do not power wash or use any superficial preservatives, because they cause the top to dry out in the sun. After spending a couple hours on exterior, we moved to the interior cleaning. Dave removes the seats and uses a Thermax hot water extractor to clean the carpets. The dashboard is cleaned with a hand steamer and pad prior to being blown dry with an air gun. He does not use any aftermarket products on the dash, because they cause the dash to dry out. Leather seats are conditioned with Lexol conditioner.

In addition to vehicle detailing, Jeff Criss from Patriot Dent Repair demonstrated Paintless Dent Removal /Repair on Peter & Joyce Thompson's BMW door. In about 45 minutes the small dents were completely repaired. To quote Peter "I would highly recommend Jeff". Jeff is an expert repairing exotic and luxury cars. Amelia Island Concours 2015

Once each year Amelia Island becomes the center of the automobile universe, and this year that fact was brought home more than ever before.

The week of March 9th through the 15th marked the twentieth annual Amelia Island Concours d 'Elegance, the centerpiece of the Island's automotive activities, culminating on Sunday with the display of more than 300 invited vehicles from all over this country, and the world. A record crowd exceeding 32,000 spectators packed the 10th and 18th fairways of the Golf Club of Amelia Island to view Sunday's show under bright blue skies and wonderfully warm weather.

Each year the Concours features two or three marques celebrating historic milestones. This year featured Stutz and 'Cars of the Cowboys'. 914's also featured prominently, with eight or ten 914-6's with outstanding race provenance. Sir Stirling Moss was the honored guest, and the field featured a collection of two dozen of the cars he had raced over his illustrious career. Best of show went to a 1930 Cord L29 Brooks Stevens Speedster owned by Ed and Judy Schoenthaler Collection in Oak Brook, IL.

The Concours is principally a four day event, centered at the Ritz-Carleton adjoining the golf club. Starting on Thursday, events include a running silent auction, preview of the cars slated for RM Sotheby's Saturday auction, and Guardians of the Porsche Wine Makers Dinner. Events Friday include high speed driving and autocross at the Fernandina Beach Airport – how about the chance to sit in the right seat beside Hurley Haywood to 'see what this baby can do'! There is also a Tour of Amelia involving many of the cars invited to be shown at Sunday's Concours. Saturday is highlighted by seminars at the Ritz, and test drives of new offerings from Lamborghini, Ferrari, Jaguar, Aston Martin, and of course Porsche. Saturday afternoon and evening feature the RM Sotheby auction, which enjoyed 100% sell-through and generated sixty million in sales.

Topping the list was a 1960 Ferrari F400 SuperAmerica SWB Cabriolet at \$6.38 million. Porsche sales results were more or less in line with expectations. Porsche valuations have flattened a little this year, not surprising considering the triple digit growth experienced over last five. A 1975 Carrera 2.7 sold for \$308k, a 1988 Flachbau Turbo for \$363k, and a 1973 RS Touring for \$891k. Early S's were generally between \$150k-\$250k.

In addition Gooding and Co, another auction house operating out of the Omni Plantation, garnered \$27 million in consignment sales, with a 1974 RSR leading the Porsche pack at \$1.24 million, followed closely by a 1996 GT2 at \$973k. A 1994 964 Turbo 3.6 sold for \$330k, and a 1997 993 Turbo S for \$440,000. Bonham's Auctions made an appearance for the first time, taking up shop on one of the fairways of the adjacent Fernandina Beach Municipal course, and another newcomer, Hollywood Wheels tried its hand as well.

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Festival of Speed also held a show Saturday on the 9th fairway at the Omni Plantation course, and drew large crowds in its third appearance on the Island. A 2015 Pagani Huyara supercar sporting a 730-hp Mercedes-AMG V-12 surrounded by a carbon fiber skin with hand-made luggage in special side bins was a big hit...at a price of \$1.5 million, and a 231-mph top speed. Close by, dual 1,004-hp Koenigsegg CCXR models were on display, along with a classic Jeep dragster, multiple Ferraris, Lamborghinis and McLarens, and many other classics as well.





Precision Imports, is no stranger to the IMS. Porsche has been using an IMS for along time. The 547 Carrera engine had one, in fact every 911 ever built has one. In the early engines, the IMS is known as a "layshaft" and does not present issues, even though it had the exact same job as the current IMS in regard to driving the camshafts. The problem is not the IMS but the IMSB (Intermediate Shaft Bearing) in the M96 and M97 engines.




